In Art we have started our wire sculptures by creating a loose outline of the shape from our portraits.










In English, we have been working in groups to create a PowerPoint about the author of Skellig. The boys had to present it to rest of the class to discuss their findings.
















Hands move quickly backwards and forwards together by wrist movement






**Jesus**: Dominant middle finger touches centre of other palm, then repeat with non-dominant hand.










Angel: Hands make slight flutter movements.
