They will learn how to present the same calculation in different forms using a variety of resources and build their confidence in understanding and memorising multiplication facts. In terms 6 we will be looking at how our nervous systems and hormones control our body which will lead on to studying different types of reproduction, how hormones control the menstrual cycle and how they can be used, with other methods, to control fertility.
