
































In Music we have continued learning about music from around the world. This time we went to Australia. We had fun having a go on the didgeridoo.










In DT we have started to look at the new project. We have been researching the different types of engineers. Specifically, we have been looking at the Dyson institute and some of their projects.

In Maths we have been working together to work out different fractions.






In Science we have started our first AQA coursework papers for our electromagnetism investigation. The boys are working very hard to complete this to the best of their ability!




We continued our circuit building skills in science and made electromagnets! Archer managed to make an electromagnetic strong enough to pick up 8 paperclips!







> In Land-Based Studies we were working together to set up fencing in a mock scenario. We learned about electric fencing although ours was not wired up!



On Day two we were based at the John Moore Museum. We learnt about the flood defense precautions people in the community can take and went for a walk by the Avon to see some of these for ourselves.






Also, a big shout out to those pupils back in school who shared their views with the Ofsted inspectors.

Well done for having a mature attitude and taking this in your stride!










































So for this sentence starter you would only sign the word "month", to do this.


You would have your "non dominant" hand flat, and with your other hand you use your three middle fingers (like you would for the letter M) and tap your non dominant hand once!




You use your dominant hand and your index finger and point to your chest.




